CHEVRON NAPKINS!

A simple pattern for handmade napkins that creates extra festivity at any dinner table!



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Chevron napkin pattern by Emily Steffen

Makes one set of FOUR napkins Finished napkin size 13x13

Fabric requirements

*1/2 yard each of two different cotton fabrics*1/4 yard of a coordinating fabric for chevron

Other supplies *Coordinating thread *turning tool

STEP ONE :: Cut out all piecesa. from fabric one, cut16 triangles4 - 3 x 13.5 strips2-13.5 x 13.5 squares

b. from fabric two, cut16 triangles4- 5 x 13.5 squares2-13.5 x 13.5 squares

c. from fabric three, cut32 triangles

STEP TWO :: Assemble chevron a. lay out 4 triangles from fabric one, 8 triangles from fabric two and 4 triangles from fabric three into the chevron pattern as in figure 1 b. Start by assembling row one of the chevron pattern. With right sides together sew block one together by joining the long side of the triangle with a 1/4 inch seam allowance. Press seam allowance to one side

c. Repeat step b with blocks 2, 3 and 4

d. With right sides together, join blocks 1 and


2 with a 1/4 inch seam. Press seam allowance to one side.

e. With right sides together, join blocks 3 and 4 with a 1/4 inch seam. Press seam allowance to one side.

f. Complete the first row of the chevron pattern by sewing blocks 1 and 2 with blocks 3 and 4 to create a strip. Press seam allowance to one side.

g. Repeat steps a-f with the bottom chevron row using blocks 5, 6, 7 and 8

h. With right sides together join the top row of the chevron pattern with the bottom row using a 1/4 inch seam allowance. Press seam allowance to one side.



STEP THREE :: Finish napkin top a. With right sides together sew, one of the 3 x 13.5 inch strips along the long side of the top of the chevron pattern with a 1/4 inch seam allowance. Press seam allowance to one side. b. With right sides together, sew one of the 5x13.5 inch strips along the long side to the bottom of the chevron pattern with a 1/4 inch seam allowance. Press seam allowance to one side.

Your napkin top is now complete.

STEP FOUR :: Add napkin back


a. With right sides together, pin the finished napkin top to one of the 13.5 x 13.5 inch square backs. Sew the front to the back with a 1/4 inch seam allowance, backstitching at each end. Leave a 1 inch opening for turning.
b. With a scissors, edge clip the 4 corners so that it does not bunch when turned.

STEP FIVE :: Finish

a. Turn the napkin right side out, pushing out the corners with a turning tool so that it lays flat. Press the napkin, making sure the unfinished, 1 inch portion is pressed in.b. Top stitch about 1/8 inch away from all 4 edges of the napkin to give it a finished look.

*Complete Steps 1-5 for the remaining 3 napkins to complete the set! :)





These pattrn pieces are shown at 100% scale on an 8.5x11 sheet. No need to add seam allowances, 1/4" seam allowance already added.

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
